1. Overview

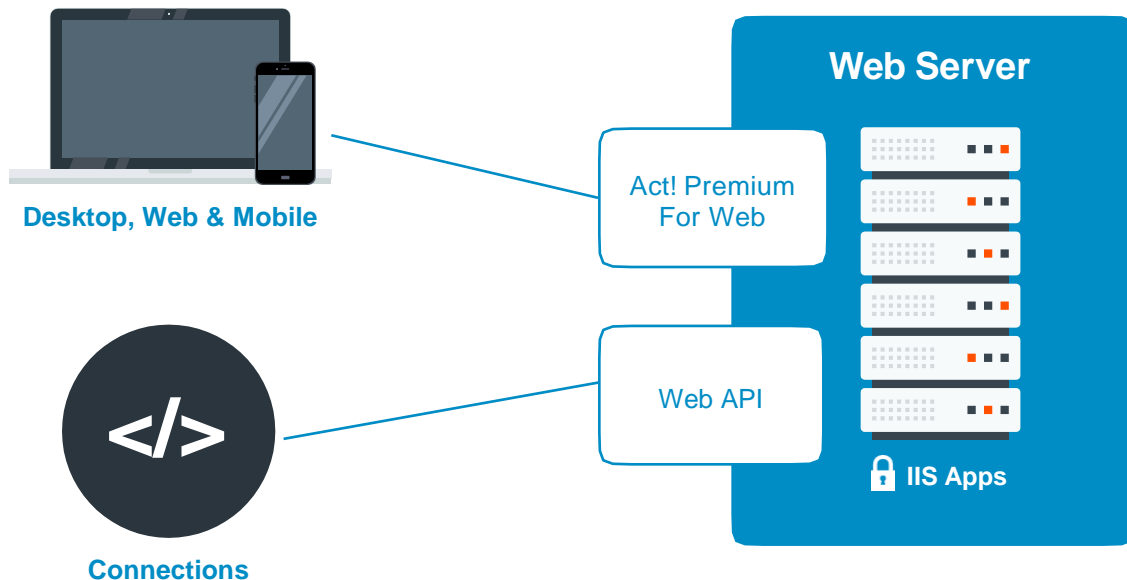

REST APIs are the modern integration glue, platform and language agnostic, simpler and cheaper to develop with.

2. Installation

Act! Web API is an IIS application that should be installed on the same web server as Act! (Web). The Web API is compatible with Act! (Web) v18 or greater.



Act! Web API can be installed on Windows: 10, 8+ or for Windows Servers: 2016, 2012, 2012 R2. Check the full Act! system requirements [here](#). It is strongly recommended to review Act! (Web) Administrator's Guide as part of installation of Web API.

3. Configuration

Web API uses the same configuration as Act! (Web) to enable Act! databases for access. If you have already administered your databases for access, you have completed this step. Otherwise, to configure, see [Act! \(Web\) Administrator's Guide](#).

4. Securing Your Web Server

To enjoy integrations and services that use Web API, you will need to secure your web server with a Certificate Authority (CA) issued certificate.

5. Test Your Connection

If you have successfully followed the previous steps, you should be able to test that Web API is successfully installed.

Depending on your version, browse to:

`https://<insert_your_server_name>/Act.Web.API/Help`

or

`https://<insert_your_server_name>/Act.Web.API/swagger/index.html`

You will see a web page where you can enter your username, password, and database name. If everything is working, you will be able to see a “bearer token” generated after hitting the ‘Test’ or ‘Login’ button.
